## 2021 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES



## PANDEMIC RESPONSE

- ✓ The County supports funding, programs and regulatory changes to assist in the public health response to COVID-19, including staffing; disease monitoring and contact tracing; laboratory and other medical equipment; testing; health care system surge capacity; public education and communication; measures to address equity issues; strengthening partnerships and response among the local health care delivery system; and more.
- ✓ The County supports funding, programs and regulatory changes necessary to protect the health, safety and well-being of the community during the COVID-19 pandemic, including additional unemployment benefits and wage replacement; protective equipment and testing necessary to continue essential community operations such as medical offices, schools, community-based services, essential businesses and more; eviction protections; housing and shelter for vulnerable populations; and other measures.
- ✓ The County supports funding, programs and regulatory changes intended to preserve government operations during the COVID-19 pandemic and its aftermath, including financial support to protect and continue local programs and services necessary for the community.

## CZU FIRE RECOVERY

- ✓ The County supports funding, programs and regulatory changes to support fire survivors, including debris removal and cleanup; post-fire insurance navigation; rebuilding and reconstruction; short, intermediate and long-term housing needs; environmental and watershed restoration and recovery; and more.
- ✓ The County supports funding, programs and regulatory actions to support community resiliency to wildfires and other natural disasters, including support for emergency and public safety response; community preparedness; disaster sheltering; availability, affordability and scope of insurance coverage; resiliency of public infrastructure and utilities; and more.

## STATE AND FEDERAL

- ✓ The County continues to support funding to address the opioid crisis, including for Drug Medi-Cal services and access to substance use disorder services, as well as Medication for Addiction Treatment (MAT) and Withdrawal Management.
- ✓ The County continues to support policies and actions to limit enrollment at University of California-Santa Cruz to match community resources and to fully mitigate the community impacts of any future growth, including providing infrastructure needed to support that growth.
- ✓ The County supports continued funding for the Pajaro Valley Flood Risk Management Project.
